TONIGHT'S GAME OVERVIEW

The Rochester Americans (11-7-3-0) carry a three-game win streak into the start of a season-long five-game road swing tonight with the first of back-to-back meetings against the Charlotte Checkers (10-4-1-2) at Bojangles Coliseum. The 7:00 p.m. matchup will be carried live on The Sports Leader 95.7 FM/950 AM The Fan Rochester as well as AHLTV on FloHockey.

Rochester has earned at least one point in 13 of its last 17 games dating back to Oct. 23 and is 7-2-1-0 over its last 10 road contests. The Amerks are tied for third place in the AHL's North Division standings with Toronto but the Marlies have four games in hand entering the weekend.

Charlotte, too, has been hot as of late, earning eight out of a possible 10 points over its current five-game point streak, including wins in each of its last three as well.

HEAD-TO-HEAD RESULTS AGAINST THE CHECKERS

The Amerks are 8-16-0-0 all-time against Charlotte after splitting the four meetings with the Checkers last season, including the only get-together in Bojangles' Coliseum. Rochester suffered a 5-2 setback in the 2024 Queen City Outdoor Classic at Truist Field.

With the 3-2 win in the first game in Charlotte last season, Rochester has won the last three games at Bojangles Coliseum dating back to last season. Overall, the club boasts a 3-1-0-0 record over that span in the Queen City.

Since the start of the 2022-23 season, **Brett Murray** (2+6), **Lukas Rousek** (1+5), and **Isak Rosén** (2+2) have combined for five goals and 18 points against the Checkers. Murray and Rousek have appeared in all eight games versus Charlotte while Rosén skated in all but one contest.

Kale Clague topped all Rochester skaters during the 2023-24 season series against Charlotte with four points (1+3) while he, Murray and Rousek all had three assists. Rosén totaled a pair of points for the second straight season as he scored once to go with an assist.

Goaltenders **Michael Houser** (6-3-2) and **Felix Sandström** (5-6-0) have each posted a four-win season against Charlotte in their respective careers and together show an 11-9-2 combined record. Houser's (4-0-1) came in 2014-15 with San Antonio while Sandström (4-1-0) was nearly perfect oppisote the Checkers during the 2023-24 campaign with Lehigh Valley.

LAST TIME OUT

The Amerks jumped out to a 3-0 lead in the second period before holding off a late push by the Utica Comets for a 3-2 victory Wednesday night at Blue Cross Arena.

The line trio of **Brett Murray**, **Konsta Helenius**, and **Riley Fiddler Schultz** combined for three goals and three assists as they helped the Amerks to their second straight 3-2 victory. Fiddler-Schultz's two-point outing was his first of his AHL career while Helenius notched his second of the season. Murray, who began the night with four goals over his last six outings, netted his first even strength goal of the season and seventh overall.

Zachary Metsa and **Graham Slaggert** both notched an assist on Fiddler-Schutlz's second-period goal to close out the scoring.

Devon Levi (4-1-1) made 21 saves to earn his third straight win while also making his fourth straight start. Over his current three-game win streak, Levi hasn't allowed more than two goals in each game and has stopped 54 of the 58 shots he's faced, good for a 1.30 GAA and a .931 save percentage.

LEANING ON LEVI

Devon Levi, who made his season debut for the Amerks on Nov. 20 at Laval, has started each of the last four games for Rochester.

The 22-year old netminder split his first full rookie season between Buffalo and Rochester in 2023-24 by combining to post a 26-14-6 mark in 49 appearances. The Quebec native also showed a 2-3 record in five Calder Cup Playoffs with the Amerks.

In Game 3 of the North Division Semifinals against Syracuse, Levi turned aside 60 of 62 shots he faced in the double-overtime victory. Levi was the first Amerks goaltender to make 21 or more saves in a single period during a Calder Cup Playoff game since **Tyler Plante** stopped all 23 shots he faced on April 21, 2010 against Abbotsford.

Levi, who showed a 16-6-4 record in 26 appearances with the Amerks, held the opposition to three or fewer goals in each game over a six-game win streak between March and April 6. He totaled 188 saves on 201 shots while boasting an impressive 2.17 goals-against average and a .935 save percentage over that span.

Levi earned the start in 24 of the last 34 games with Rochester since being reassigned on Jan. 20, including five straight to open February. He won nine of his last 11 starts and 11 of 13 dating back to the start of March.

His career-high 52-save performance in the Amerks overtime win at Toronto on Feb. 19 were the most by an Amerks goaltender since **Ukko-Pekka Luukkonen** had 54 in a 2-1 win at Syracuse on Feb. 25, 2022.

Levi, who finished the season tied for fourth among all rookie netminders with a .927 save percentage, has held the opposition to three or fewer goals in all but six of his 32 appearances. He boasts a record 20-2-4 in those games.

Levi won the Mike Richter Award, given annually to the top goaltender in men's college hockey, for the second straight year following the 2022-23 season. Levi is the only two-time winner in the award's history.

He led the nation again with a .933 save percentage, one year after he set the second-best mark in NCAA history with a .952 save percentage. He tied for third in the nation in both shutouts (6) and saves (1,183). Levi's 16-career shutouts are a Northeastern University school record.

During last Friday night's 3-0 win over Syracuse, Levi stopped all 20 shots he faced, which included 13 in the final period of regulation, to earn his first professional shutout. It marked the first time he blanked an opponent since he made 32 saves in a 4-0 win over Massachusetts on Feb. 25, 2023 with Northeastern University.





NO METSA'IN AROUND

Second-year defenseman **Zachary Metsa** enters the weekend third on the team in scoring and first amongst all Rochester's blueliners with 13 points (1+12) through his first 21 games.

Metsa has points in eight of his last 17 games, which included stringing together consecutive multi-point games for the first time in his career, logging five assists in that span and punctuated by a three-assist effort in the win over Hartford on Nov. 8.

The second-year blueliner's 13 points tie him for ninth-most in league scoring by a defenseman.

Last season, the Delafield, Wisconsin, native logged seven goals and 24 points and was named the team's co-Rookie of the Year with Viktor Neuchev.

Metsa, who captained Quinnipiac University to its first-ever NCAA National Championship in 2023, is also tied for fourth amongst all AHL defensemen with 12 assists, five of which have come on the power-play.

MURRAY SPECIAL AND MR. 300

Six of **Brett Murray**'s seven goals this season have come on the power-play, including two which ended up being the game-winner.

The 26-year-old is tied with Checkers forward and former Amerk Kyle Criscuolo for the AHL lead in power-play goals and is also second on the Amerks in points with 14 (7+7) through 21 games.

Prior to scoring his first even strength goal of the season Wednesday against Utica, Murray was the only AHL player with at least six goals this season to have scored all his goals on the power-play.

With the exception of his rookie season, the veteran forward has recorded at least six power-play goals in five of his first six professional seasons, which includes a career-high eight during the 2022-23 campaign.

Coming into tonight having played 280 games as an Amerk, Murray is 20 games away from becoming just the 24th forward in franchise history to appear in at least 300 games with the club and first since Phil Varone did so during the 2015-16 campaign. He's also 68 games away from tying Don McSween for 20th on the franchise's all-time games played list (348).
