## Cleveland Monsters vs. Rochester Americans

Friday, December 14, 2018 @ The Blue Cross Arena | AHL Regular Season Game No. 399

### TONIGHT'S GAME OVERVIEW

- The Rochester Americans (16-7-2-0) remain at home tonight as they host the Cleveland Monsters (13-9-3-0) in the front-end of a weekend home-and-home series at The Blue Cross Arena. The 7:05 p.m. matchup will be the second of eight meetings between the North Division rivals this season and will be carried live on The Sports Leader AM 950/95.7 FM ESPN Rochester as well as AHLTV.

### LAST TIME OUT

- Entering Wednesday's contest the winners of three straight, the Amerks' bid to extend their winning streak to four was halted in a 5-1 loss to the intrastate rival Binghamton Devils.
- Despite suffering their first Wednesday night loss of the season, the Amerks have won five of their last seven games while also earning 34 of a possible 46 points in the last 23 contests. Rochester also remains atop the AHL's North Division standings heading into this weekend's home-and-home series with the Monsters, who are just five points back of the Amerks coming into the weekend.
- Sean Malone** scored his second goal of the season in the defeat while goaltender **Jonas Johansson** made his third appearance in the last four contests, finishing with six saves in the first 22 minutes before being replaced by **Adam Wilcox**. Johansson was dealt his first loss of the season as Wilcox stopped 20 of 21 shots he faced in relief.

### ROAD AHEAD FOR AMERKS

- After a quick turnaround, the same two teams clash for the second time in as many nights as the action shifts to Quicken Loans Arena on Saturday, Dec. 15 for a 7:00 p.m. rematch in Cleveland. All of the action will be carried live on The Sports Leader AM 950/ 95.7 FM ESPN Rochester as well as AHLTV.

### REDMOND CHASING HISTORY

- With 14 goals in 25 games already this season, **Zach Redmond** is on a record-setting pace to etch his name in team history. Earlier this season, he became the fastest Amerks defenseman to score 10 goals in the fewest amount of games to begin the season since Amerks Hall of Famer **Don McSween** reached the mark in his first 21 games during the 1989-90 campaign. McSween would later go on to become the top scoring defenseman in franchise history. Redmond, who last season became just the first Amerk blueliner in seven years to lead the team in scoring, is just one goal away from matching his career-high of 15 from last season and needs only four more goals to tie the single-season franchise record for the most by a defenseman of 18, set by Hall of Famer **Rick Pagnutti** during the 1972-73 season. The AHL record for goals scored by a defenseman is held by John Slaney, who netted 30 for the Wilkes-Barre/Scranton Penguins during the 1999-00 campaign.

### PILUT TAKES FLIGHT

• Rochester's blueline continues to be without defenseman **Lawrence Pilut**, who remains on recall with the Buffalo Sabres. The first-year AHLer recorded his first NHL point with an assist in Buffalo's 6-2 loss to the Philadelphia Flyers last Saturday and added another in Tuesday night's 4-3 overtime win over the Los Angeles Kings. Before re-joining the Sabres on his second recall in six days, Pilut saw his career-long seven-game point streak end. It was just the third time all season that the former SHL Defenseman of the Year had been held without a point. Pilut has recorded nearly half of his 22 points on the power-play this season, including two of his three goals, which are tied for ninth among all AHL blueliners. He has recorded points in 12 of his last 14 games and is tied for fourth in the AHL in with 19 assists, while his team-best plus-19 on-ice rating is tied for the best mark in the league in that category. His 22 points, meanwhile, are tied for second among all AHL defensemen.

### RED HOT 'REDS'

• Redmond has scored a team-high 14 goals this season, including six that have held up as game-winning goals, a new career-high, while six have also been scored on the man-advantage, good enough for fifth in the league in that category. Redmond, who had an AHL-best nine-game point streak to end the month of October, is tied for third in the league in goals (14) and leads all defensemen with 23 points, while his six game-winning goals are tops in the AHL.

### IRON MAN SIMPSON

• **Wayne Simpson** is the AHL's current leader in consecutive games played with 212. Prior to joining the Amerks, the Boxborough, Mass., native appeared in all 76 regular-season games with the Hershey Bears and Providence Bruins over each of the last two seasons, in addition to 35 straight appearances for the Portland Pirates dating back to the 2015-16 campaign. Simpson has tallied 14 points on eight goals and six assists through 25 games this season.

### BUSY BETWEEN THE PIPES

• Goaltender **Scott Wedgewood** has gotten the nod between the pipes in 11 of the last 17 games for Rochester. After dropping his first two games of the season, the sixth-year netminder won five straight to close out the month of October, matching the career-best mark he set while backstopping the Albany Devils during the 2015-16 season. He enters the weekend tied for third among all AHL goaltenders in shutouts (2) and tied for seventh in wins (8).

### HUNWICK ARRIVES ON CONDITIONING ASSIGNMENT

• The Buffalo Sabres earlier this week assigned defenseman **Matt Hunwick** the Amerks on a conditioning assignment. The 33-year-old finally made his highly anticipated season debut in Wednesday's loss to Binghamton, recording an assist. It marked his first pro game since Apr. 1, 2018 as a member of the Pittsburgh Penguins (NHL) and first at the AHL level since Mar. 26, 2014 while with the Monsters.

### SERIES NOTABLES

- Amerks assistant coach **Toby Petersen** spent the 2015-16 and 2016-17 seasons behind the bench with the Monsters. Petersen helped the team earn its first Calder Cup in 2016.
- Tonight is the second game between the Amerks and Monsters since the 2015-16 season. Rochester holds a record of 21-5-2-3 over Cleveland since the start of the 2011-12 campaign.
- Monsters captain Nathan Gerbe spent five seasons in the Buffalo Sabres organization from 2008-12 and was named the AHL's Rookie of the Year in 2008-09 after leading all first-year players with 56 points (30+26) in 57 games for the Portland Pirates.
