## Syracuse Crunch vs. Rochester Americans

Friday, February 15, 2019 @ The Blue Cross Arena | AHL Regular Season Game No. 777

### TONIGHT'S GAME OVERVIEW

- The Rochester Americans (29-15-3-2) open up their second three-in-three of the season tonight when they welcome back the Syracuse Crunch (29-15-2-1) to The Blue Cross Arena. Game time is slated for a 7:05 p.m. start and will be carried live on The Sports Leader AM 950/95.7 FM ESPN Rochester as well as AHLTV.

### LAST TIME OUT

- The Amerks came up on the short end of a 5-2 decision Tuesday night against the Cleveland Monsters at Quicken Loans Arena. It was just the second time all season that the Amerks suffered back-to-back regulation road losses.
- Even with Tuesday's defeat, the Amerks have collected 17 out of a possible 24 points in their last 12 games and maintain their first-place lead atop the AHL's North Division standings going into this weekend's home-and-home series with the Crunch. Rochester has also notched 25 points in its last 19 games dating back to a 4-0 shutout win in Cleveland on Dec. 26.
- Forward **Remi Elie** scored his first goal as an Amerk and later assisted on **Wayne Simpson's** third-period goal for the Amerks, who show a record of 24-6-2-3 against Cleveland since the start of the 2011-12 season, which includes a 10-2-1-0 record in the last 14 meetings. Goaltender **Scott Wedgewood** (17-8-2), who has won eight of his last 11 games dating back to the day after Christmas, was tagged with the loss as he made 29 saves.

### ROAD AHEAD FOR AMERKS

- The Amerks meet the Crunch again Saturday night as the home-and-home series shifts to the War Memorial Arena in Syracuse for the seventh meeting this season between the longtime rivals. Rochester will close out the weekend on Sunday, Feb. 17 at 3:05 p.m. with a matinee against the Binghamton Devils at The Blue Cross Arena. Both games will be carried live on The Sports Leader AM 950/95.7 FM ESPN Rochester as well as AHLTV.

### RECORD BELONGS TO REDMOND

- Veteran defenseman **Zach Redmond** broke the 46-year-old single-season franchise record back on Jan. 23, scoring his team-leading 19<sup>th</sup> goal of the season in a 7-5 win over Binghamton at The Blue Cross Arena.
- Redmond surpassed Amerks Hall of Famer **Rick Pagnutti**, who set the original mark with 18 goals during the 1972-73 campaign. He'll also become the first defenseman in the 63-history of the franchise to reach the 20-goal mark on his next goal.
- Redmond also remains on pace to tie the AHL record of 30, set by John Stanley during the 1990-00 with Wilkes-Barre/Scranton.

### OLOFSSON LEADING THE WAY

- On the strength of his second four-point effort of the season last Friday highlighted by his first career hat trick, **Victor Olofsson** leads the club with 43 points (19+24) in 46 games this season and is one of just two Rochester skaters to surpass the 40-point mark. A year after pacing the SHL with 27 goals, Olofsson has been averaging nearly a point-per-game, leading the team with 24 assists while sharing the team-lead in goals (19). Olofsson, who earned CCM/AHL Player of the Month honors for October, is also tied for third in the AHL in game-winning goals (6) and 14<sup>th</sup> in power-play assists (13) while ranking 15<sup>th</sup> among the league's top point-getters. He hasn't gone more than three straight games without a point all season.

### RED HOT 'REDS'

- Redmond has scored a team and career-high 19 goals, including nine on the power-play, good enough for ninth in the league in that category. Redmond, who had an AHL-best nine-game point streak to end the month of October, enters the week leading all AHL defenseman with 39 points, while his eight game-winning goals are tops in the AHL. His 19 goals and 138 shots are also the most by an AHL blueliner this season.

### C.J. REMAINS IN BUFFALO

- Prior to earning his second NHL recall to the Buffalo Sabres last Monday, **C.J. Smith** recorded 22 points (11+11) in his last 16 games with Rochester dating back to Dec. 14. Smith, who scored for the second straight game for Buffalo last Monday against Minnesota, has notched a career-high 18 goals while his 23 assists rank second-most on the club. Smith has 41 points in 41 games this season for Rochester, tying him for 21<sup>st</sup> among the league's top scorers.

### BUSY BETWEEN THE PIPES

- Scott Wedgewood** (17-7-2) has gotten the nod in 14 of the last 21 games for the Amerks, going 9-4-1 over that span while winning eight of his last 11 dating back to a 31-save shutout at Cleveland the day after Christmas. After dropping his first two games of the season, the sixth-year netminder won a season-long five straight to close out the month of October, matching the career-best mark he set while backstopping the Albany Devils during the 2015-16 season. He enters the weekend tied for third among all AHL goaltenders in shutouts (3) while his career-high 17 wins are tied for sixth.

### SPECIAL TEAMS ROLLING

- Since the turn of the New Year, Rochester's shorthanded unit has successfully killed 49 of 52 penalties in the last 16 games, which also includes only one power-play goal scored by the opposition in 12 games.
- In addition to the team's recent success on the penalty kill, the Amerks have the league's eighth-best power-play percentage (21.2%) while going 22-for-75 over the last 19 games. Rochester also owns AHL's second-best road power-play percentage (26.0%).

### SERIES NOTABLES

- The Amerks have scored a power-play goal in 12 of the last 13 games against Syracuse, going 16-for-65 (24.6%) with the man-advantage over that span.
- In the first five get-togethers between the two teams this season, the Amerks tallied six of their 14 goals on special teams, which includes five on the power-play.
